“Track Side with Chad Colby”

Minto, ND (Dec. 29, 2008) - USCC has expanded its race coverage for 2009. A partnership with X-Games Gold Medalist, Chris Burandt has launched a new post-race program called “Track Side with Chad Colby” presented by Burandt’s Backcountry Adventure. Colby’s program is designed to provide an inside look into cross-country racing that includes video interviews from drivers, factory personnel, sponsors and more. The show, which includes a race recap segment, will be posted to USCC’s website on Wednesday following each sanctioned race. President for USCC Pat Mach said, “The new items we are bringing on this year are going to be great for our fans, racers and sponsors. Chad’s show is going to give our series sponsors and racers more exposure than they’ve had in the past. Chad will do a great job and I’m thrilled that Chris Burandt is on board to help us out!”

Burandt’s true passion for snowmobiling comes in Colorado’s most scenic back country. He loves the sense of exploration as he wanders through areas where most riders will never get a chance to see. He feels a sensation of adventure around every corner and the challenge that stares him in the face at every hill. These are all the things he lives for when he rides and he wanted to share this experience with others; thus his new quest...Burandt’s Back Country Adventure. The Gold Medalist has teamed up with Arctic Cat and some of the industries elite aftermarket companies to provide a breathtaking riding experience through the rugged Rocky Mountains. Burandt’s Backcountry Adventure is the perfect escape for those who crave adventure and excitement.

Chris is excited about his partnership with USCC. He said, “It’s really cool for me to get hooked up with Arctic Cat/Burandt’s Back Country Adventure racer Chad Colby and the USCC crew. Cross-country racing is the true definition of grass roots snowmobile racing. It’s awesome that the USCC circuit is bringing back this exciting form of racing to the main stage again. I look forward to promoting the cross-country circuit and who knows...maybe I can get a program put together and run a race with my fellow enthusiasts!”

Chad Colby is no stranger to the sport of snowmobiling. He began racing in 1990 at age 19 and he has enjoyed success in grass drags, ice drags, snow-cross and most recently cross-country, winning the USCC Yamaha Sport 85 point’s championship in 2007. Last year during the Red Lake I-500 in Thief River Falls, MN, Colby developed sled problems; this forced his 1st DNF at the “500”. Chad was asked to help with radio broadcasting; it was very well received and he was asked to return. Rather than racing the full series now he will join track announcer Don Jorstad in the broadcast booth as a commentator for the series. Colby said, “I’m real excited to join the USCC team. Over the past 5 years I have enjoyed racing cross-country; that experience alone, and with my 30 years of snowmobile riding, should give our racers, sponsors and fans a unique look into the sport we enjoy so much.” Colby lives in Morton, Illinois with his wife Ginger and step-daughter Amber.
